#### **O**ther General Items

- Temperature checks

- Masks we plan to supply staff with a medical grade mask at least once a week
  - What type of mask should we use/is the type that the fire department orders for the town adequate?
  - What is the optimal frequency for providing masks?
- Checklist for families
  - We need to develop a checklist for families to use every morning before sending their kids to school.
  - Do we collect the checklist daily (ie, require electronic submittal via an app etc.)?
- Would staff follow the same screening protocol as other Wayland municipal employees?
