“Shop-Around Shuttle”

A COA pilot program



Mondays: August 15, 22, 29 AND September 12, 19, 26, 2016

In response to your requests, Wayland COA will pilot a free weekly Wayland-based shopping bus during August and September.

The *Shop-Around Shuttle* is designed as a shared ride and will offer home pick-ups and a fixed choice of local destinations.

- 🚐 The shuttle is free for Wayland residents 60 and older.
- 🚐 Reservations are required. Call the COA at 508-358-2990 by 3:00pm on the Thursday before.
- 🚐 The shuttle sets out at 9:30am to pick up residents at their homes. Once all are on board, the shuttle makes two loops.
- 🚐 Riders must be able to do their own shopping or bring an aide/helper if one is needed. Please reserve two seats if you are bringing help.
- 🚐 If the van is full you are limited to two shopping bags. The driver will help secure shopping bags in the van and will even carry them to your front door. The driver may not bring the bags into your home.
- 🚐 We will run a trial van on six Mondays in August and September: **August 15, 22 and 29 and September 12, 19 and 26.** Please give it a try!



Reservations required. Starting at 9:30am, the shuttle picks up participants at their homes. Once all participants are on-board, the following route is traveled. Rides home begin at completion of 2nd loop (starting approximately 12:30 PM).
