## Appendix B <br> Business Profile

Every five years, the U.S. Census Bureau releases the Economic Census. The Economic Census can be useful in identifying what specific industries exist in a community as well as their relative significance. ${ }^{1}$ One method of evaluating significance is to identify the share of employment that a certain sub-industry represents within a community. Other factors can also be revealing, such as the annual sales or receipts of the industry, the annual payroll, and the average wage being paid to employees in that industry or subindustry. See Tables B-1 through B-4 for these summaries. ${ }^{2}$

This change makes direct comparisons to previous years' data sets problematic.
    ${ }^{2}$ The industry breakdowns in this U.S. Census information are not directly comparable to the employment information presented in Table $\qquad$ , which is provided by the Massachusetts Division of Employment and Training. Nevertheless, the information is useful in identifying sub-industry information on wages, employment, and number of establishments.
