Purpose: At 8:19 a.m., C. Karlson called the session to order in the Selectmen's Meeting Room, Wayland Town Building by unanimous roll call vote of the Board (YEA: L. Anderson, M. Antes, T. Fay, C. Karlson. ABSENT: D. Levine. ABSTAIN: None. Adopted 4-0.) in open session as permitted by Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 30A, Section 21 (a) (3) to discuss strategy with respect to collective bargaining with the Wayland Teachers Association, Wayland Educational Secretaries Association, Wayland Food Service Association, Custodians & Maintenance Local 116 regarding health insurance payroll deduction, and pursuant to Massachusetts General laws, Chapter 30A, Section 21 (a) (3) to discuss strategy with respect to collective bargaining with the New England Police Benevolent Association (NEPBA)/Wayland Police Officers Union (WPOU) Local 176, and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 30A, Section 21(a) (6) to consider the purchase, exchange, taking, lease or value of real estate in regard to the Rivers Edge Project at 484-490 Boston Post Road, and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 30A, Section 21 (a) (3) to discuss strategy with respect to litigation Ordway v. Town of Wayland pending with the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 30A, Section 21 (a) (6) to discuss the purchase, exchange, lease or value of real estate with respect to the Town's agreement with Twenty Wayland, LLC, relative to property and development located off 400-440 Boston Post Road, and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 30A, Section 21(a) (6) to consider the purchase, exchange, taking, lease or value of real estate in regard to 61B Rod and Gun Club Property change in use of approximately 20,000 square feet at 4 Meadow View Road, Wayland, MA, and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 30A, Section 21 (a) (3) to discuss strategy with respect to litigation related to Kenneth Nelson v. Town of Wayland, et al., and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 30A, Section 21 (a) (3) and (6) to review and approve the executive session minutes of June 26 and July 15, 2019 with a vote to approve and hold the Executive Session minutes of June 26 and July 15, 2019, and pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 30A, Section 21 (a) (3) review and consider for potential release the following executive session minutes: October 29, 2018; December 17, 2018; January 7, 2019; February 4, 2019; March 25, 2019; April 8, 2019, May 6, 2019; and May 13, 2019. Ordway v. Town of Wayland: The grievance hearing with the Personnel Board is being rescheduled from July 30 to a date in August due to Personnel Board quorum, grievant and union availability.

The MCAD hearing is in the discovery phase and the Town has supplied documentation.
L. Miller hopes that the issue can be mediated. A conciliator/workplace mediator may be appropriate in this situation. L. Miller reported that HR Director Kathleen Buckley is also involved.
D. Levine joined the meeting at 8:27am.
Police Union Collective Bargaining: The union reached out to open collective bargaining negotiations on the contract expiring June 30, 2020. L. Miller met with the Police Chief to identify potential negotiation issues, e.g. simplifying contract terms for stipends, compensatory time and the number of administrative days. L. Miller requested assistance from Personnel Board member Phil Schneider. T. Fay questioned
M. Antes asked Karlson reminded all to work with the School Dept. and Personnel Board to determine also work with the Finance Committee
L. Anderson moved, seconded by M. Antes, to authorize the Town Administrator to begin negotiations with the Police union and to request the assistance of Personnel Board member Phil Schneider. Roll call vote of the Board. YEA: L. Anderson, M. Antes, T. Fay, C. Karlson, D. Levine. NAY: none. ABSENT: none. ABSTAIN: none. Adopted 5-0.

J. Downs left the meeting at 9:26am.

River's Edge: L. Miller updated the Board on Town Engineer P. Brinkman's discussions with Wood Partners' civil engineer. The soil costs were submitted at the maximum amount allowed under the Land Disposition Agreement (LDA) and there has not been much movement in reducing that cost. L. Miller reminded the Board that the LDA requires submission of all invoices related to soil removal and they will be based on actual costs. At this time there are too many unknowns and Wood Partners is standing firm on the number. The Board agreed that L. Miller, P. Brinkman and C. Karlson should continue negotiations with Wood Partners on the soil costs with a goal of reducing the \$3.03 million estimate

M. Antes moved, seconded by T. Fay, to authorize the Town Administrator, the Town Engineer and BoS chair to negotiate with Wood Partners to reduce the soil costs. Roll call vote of the Board. YEA: L. Anderson, M. Antes, T. Fay, C. Karlson, D. Levine. NAY: none. ABSENT: none. ABSTAIN: none. Adopted 5-0.

L. Miller explained how the Town Center wastewater facility could be used to process the River's Edge wastewater and have it piped back to a leach field on the River's Edge site. The water main work on Route 20 will provide a structure under the bridge to hold the necessary pipes. Potentially removing the cost of a wastewater treatment plant from the LDA costs would increase the land value to be received by the Town at closing. The Board consensus was to pursue a MassWorks grant to fund the piping to and from the River's Edge site.

Twenty Wayland: T. Fay updated the Board on his attempts to reach Frank Dougherty of Twenty Wayland. They traded messages but did not connect. T. Fay recommends considering other options for a Council on Aging/Community Center. L. Miller said that KPLaw is preparing

negotiating strategy to put additional pressure on Twenty Wayland. T. Fay said he would meet with the management company, National Development, to explore options.
