The Town of Wayland is issuing this addendum to provide information that was not provided in the original IFB package, as well as provide clarifications based upon questions received from Contractors relative to the project.

Acknowledgement of receipt of this addendum is required in all submitted bids.

- A) The Town has received question(s) concerning specific information in the Construction Documents. This addendum provides responses to the following question(s):
  - 1. Is the work prevailing wage? I have a ruling that says Sludge Hauling is not prevailing wage.

**Response:** The Town contacted the Division of Labor Standards for clarification on the application of prevailing wages as part of the IFB. The State provided clear separations between work that requires payment of prevailing wage rates and work that is exempt from paying prevailing wage rates. The Form of General Bid, Section 00300, has been modified to clarify the categories of work covered by prevailing wage rates and those that are exempt. Please see attached.

Item 1 – Wastewater-derived Liquid Wastes removed from Wastewater Treatment Facilities. Contractor shall provide adequate labor, equipment and materials at the location(s) identified by the Town for the collection, hauling, and disposal of the wastewater-derived liquid wastes obtained from the Town two wastewater treatment facilities. Wastewater-derived Liquid Wastes removed from Wastewater Treatment Facilities shall include wetwell, wastewater treatment plant residuals, and other liquids that were derived primarily from sanitary wastewater. Solids concentrations will vary and typically be between <0.1% to 3%. Higher percent solids may be encountered during tank cleaning and other process specific. Payment will be provided on a per gallon as approved by the Town.

Item 1A – Wastewater-derived Liquid Wastes removed from Septic Tanks. Contractor shall provide adequate labor, equipment and materials at the location(s) identified by the Town for the collection, hauling, and disposal of the wastewater-derived liquid wastes obtained from the Town septic tank facilities. Wastewater-derived Liquid Wastes removed from Septic Tanks shall include septage and other liquids that were derived primarily from sanitary wastewater. Solids concentrations will vary and typically be between <0.1% to 3%. Higher percent solids may be encountered during tank cleaning and other process specific. Payment will be provided on a per gallon as approved by the Town.
