7:00 PM APPROVAL OF PREVIOUS MEETING MINUTES

7:05 PM APPROVAL OF BILLS & PAYROLL

7:10 PM LOKER ARTICLE

Draft of Article, some place holders until designers confirm details.

2 RFQ were assessed, there's a favorite, but has not been confirmed.

Discussed CPC supported design when it was grass, but not of turf. Make edit.

Discussed draft of care & custody, omit language from draft. Discussed GIS and deed discrepancy.

Brud Wright makes a motion to approve the draft article Loker Recreation Article held as amended. Seconded by Heidi Seaborg. Discussion: None. Motion Passed with vote: 4-0-0.

7:15 PM OXBOW MEADOWS FIELD

TA suggests after Land Court date on Jan 11, expect to issue contract to survey/tree count/ which will give final tree removal estimate. Go back to ConCom, obtain Chapter 193 permit

to move forward, issue a final contract to begin construction with permit. Without shifting the field. Follow up with Town Council.

7:20 PM DUDLEY WOODS WALKING TRAILS

Wayland Archaeology Group is proposing some kind of work there, meeting tomorrow. Still waiting response from Project Notification sent to Mass History Commission. Commission on Indian Affairs hopes to repatriate the Mansion Inn artifacts. Asa- This will be done at their expense; there is not money in this project for repatriation. They are seeking CPC funds.

Dudley Pond – DPW will work on enhancements at Mansion beach if we give them a list of priorities there.

7:30 PM ATM ARTICLES

1. Loker Article

Previously voted on amended version of Article Draft.

2. COA-CACC Article

Asa – not necessarily want to be a co-sponsor, but we are certainly supportive of this article.

Brud – what's the advantage to cosponsor?

Frank – Recreation is mentioned quite a bit, will utilize the space.

Brud – asks if CPC is receptive to this?

Heidi – CPC includes recreation in their charge. Smaller project now, mostly indoors.

Asa – is 468k strictly for design? It's a lot of money.

Frank – design scope includes renovations to existing building

Alexia Obar – suggests there is a restriction that children cannot be in that building.

Asa – Raytheon still responsible for the property?

Heidi – it's been cleaned and closed. Hasn't it?

Asa – we'll look into it.

Brud – 468k for design, whats the cost of the project

Asa - 5.27 million.

3. Close 53D Beach Account Article

\$44,839 has been swept to GF and will appear in Rec Operating budget FY19 to pay indirects. Brud asks for breakdown of indirects. Asa- wants to be very sure that we are charged the same rate as every other department.

Heidi Seaborg makes a motion to close the 53D Beach Account by draft Article by the BOS Seconded by Frank Krasin.

Discussion: None. Motion Passed with vote: 4-0-0.

4. Spending Cap for Revolving Funds

Discussion regarding the history of the revolving funds and its spending cap.

a. Rec Revolving Fund

Frank Krasin makes a motion to approve the expenditure limit of \$925,000 for the Recreation Revolving Fund for FY19 to be recommended to the BOS by the Finance Director. Seconded by Brud Wright. Discussion: None. Motion Passed with vote: 4-0-0.

b. Athletic Fields Fund

Heidi Seaborg makes a motion to approve the expenditure limit of \$225,000 for the Recreation Athletic Fields Revolving Fund for FY19 to be recommended to the BOS by the Finance Director. Seconded by Brud Wright. Discussion: None. Motion Passed with vote: 4-0-0.

5. Conveyance of land at 104 Plain Street/Draper Road

Brud – does this take it off the tax roll? Heidi – good point.

Heidi Seaborg makes a motion to approve the Warrant Article to accept conveyance of land at 104 Plain Road Open Space A; pending the approval from Shelton Trust re: Open Space B.

Seconded by Frank Krasin. Discussion: Will pull the article if needed. Motion Passed with vote: 4-0-0.
