**REGULATIONS FOR INDEPENDENT REFUSE HAULERS -AMENDED**

The Board of Health of the Town of Wayland, Commonwealth of Massachusetts, acting under the authority of Chapter 111, Section 31 of the Massachusetts General Laws and any amendments and additions thereto, and by any other power thereto enabling, and acting thereunder and in accordance therewith, have, in the interest of and for the preservation of the public health, duly made and adopted the following regulations effective upon publication.

**Section 1 Permit Requirements**

- A. All persons collecting trash in the Town of Wayland shall obtain a permit from the Board of Health. A refuse hauling permit shall be valid for one calendar year, renewable annually on the first day of January, subject to review and approval from the Board of Health. No permit shall be transferable except with the approval of the Board of Health. Any application, which fails to include all information requested by the Board of Health, shall be deemed incomplete and shall be denied. As part of the application process, each applicant shall submit to the Board of Health the number of customers served, time of day and frequency of collection and the estimated tons of solid waste and recyclables handled on a regular basis.
- B. Each permittee shall provide recycling services in compliance with the State of Massachusetts Solid Waste Plan and Department of Environmental Protection Regulations. Each permittee shall submit a semi-annual report of tonnage of refuse and recyclables that has been collected. Said report shall also include the number of customers served, time of day and frequency of collection. Such reports shall be filed on the dates specified by the Board of Health. Failure to provide this required information may result in revocation or suspension of permit.
- C. All persons collecting trash in Wayland providing subscription service to households otherwise eligible for the Town's solid waste and recycling program must provide trash and recycling services at one bundled price. Residents subscribing for private waste collection shall not have the option of paying for trash collection service only, at a lower price.

- D. The Board of Health or its agents or designee shall enforce this section. Any violation of this regulation, the Department of Environmental Protection regulations or the Massachusetts General Laws, by the permittee shall be grounds for suspension, modification or revocation of the permit.
