ARTICLE 10: LIMIT DISCHARGE OF WEAPONS

I MOVE YOU SIR:

MOVED: that the Town amend §139-8 of Chapter 139 of the code of the Town of Wayland by deleting said section and replacing it with the following new section 139-8:

A No person shall carry uncased or unholstered firearms, rifles, shotguns, or pistols or discharge explosives on Town property without the prior written permission of the Board of Selectmen, or in the case of school property without the written permission of the board or officer in charge of said school, or on private property without the written permission of its owner or legal occupant thereof. This provision shall not apply to law enforcement personnel authorized by law to carry such firearms.

B. No person shall fire or discharge any type of firearm, rifle, shotgun, or pistol on land within the confines of the Town unless they are at least 1000 feet from the nearest dwelling and 1000 feet within the property line of said land, except with the consent of the owner or legal occupant of said property. This shall not apply to any lawful use within the Town where the discharge of any type of firearm is permitted prior to the effective date of this bylaw.

C. This section does not apply to the lawful defense of life or property, or to the discharge of firearms in accordance with state or federal law, or to any person in

the performance of some legal duty, or to the otherwise lawful discharge of blank ammunition.
