MINUTES

 1. WWMDC will meet with the Board of Public Works to discuss hiring a full-time Wastewater Operations Manager that will be supervised by the DPW Director (union position?). This position will oversee the operation and perform maintenance for the Wastewater Treatment Plant, High School Treatment Plant and the WWMD pipeline system.
 - 1. Fred and Uday introduced themselves.
 - 2. Fred introduced the WOM idea and sharing of cost by WWMDC and Schools
 - 3. Uday reminded the group that WWMDC's financial commitment is 60% of \$80k salary plus 60% of 42% overhead. This led to a discussion of whether there are any other costs. There is the overhead by the DPW Director and Engineer of oversight for this position, estimated to be within 80% of the FY2018 cost allocated to the Facilities dept. for aid to the WWMDC. This amount (80% of ~\$14,000) would be shifted to the DPW to enable administrative costs for the WOM to be paid. There is also an estimated cost of \$80/month or \$1000/year for use of the existing DPW vehicle by the WOM. Fred will bring up this extra cost at the regular WWMDC meeting.
 - 4. There is anticipated separate article for 2018 ATM. It will be funded in the WWMDC and School budgets. There is a need to amend the WWMDC budget for the cost of using the DPW vehicle of \$1000/year. The total for the WOM is then \$48,000 salary, \$20,160 benefits, and \$1000 vehicle or \$69,160.
 - 5. The WOM would have office space at the two treatment facilities.
 - 6. In the discussion, it was noted that no contribution to the Engineer's salary has been paid for FY2018. Fred assured the BOPW that support for Paul Brinkman's time is part of the WWMDC budget.
 - 7. The WOM will be a union position like the Water Superintendent and Highway Superintendent. There is no overtime for the WOM under this union.
 - 8. The BOPW expressed their support for this position.
